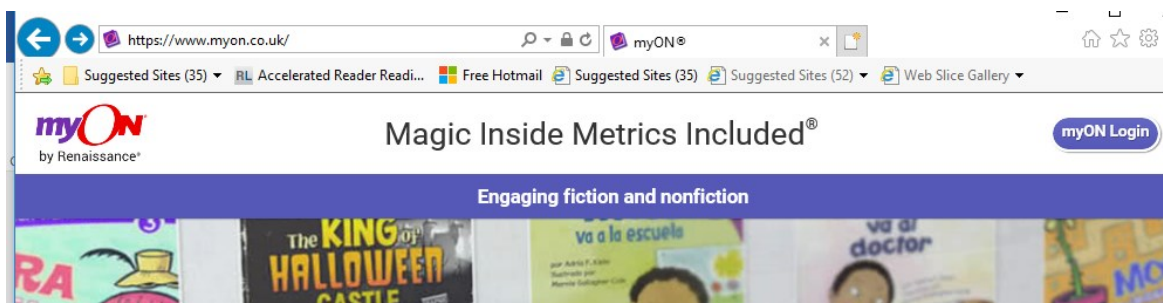
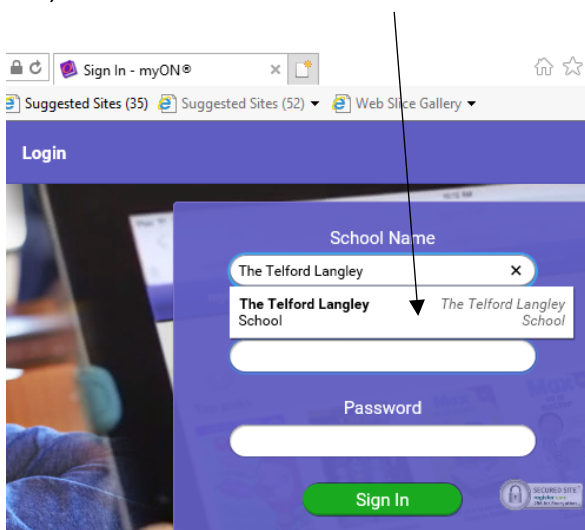


## How to use myON - The Telford Langley School – Key Stage 3

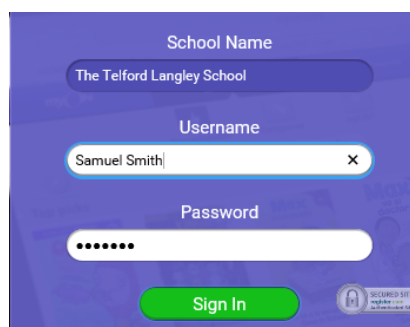
1. Go to [www.myon.co.uk](https://www.myon.co.uk). Then click on myON Login.



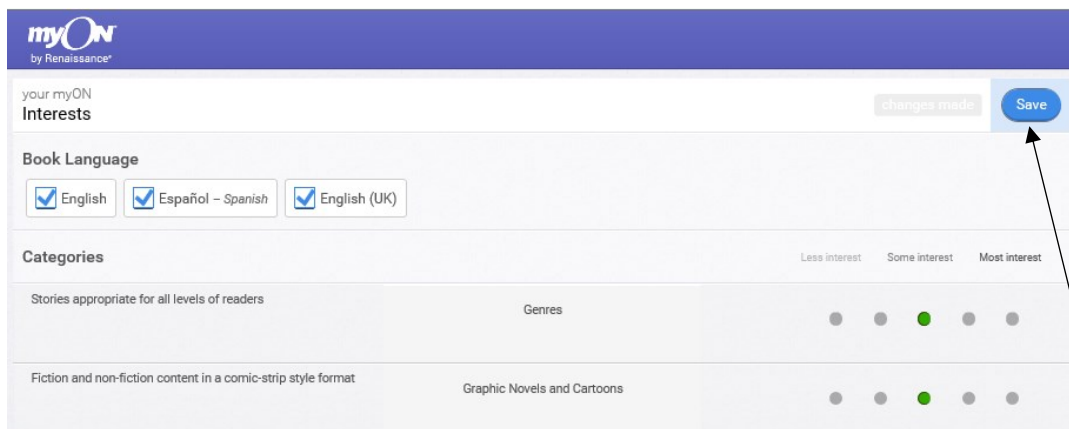
2. From the Login screen start typing 'The Telford Langley School' once it appears below the box, click on the name of the school.



3. Your login in details are your first name, followed by your surname with a space in between. If you have a hyphenated name, it will still be there. All passwords are 'langley'.

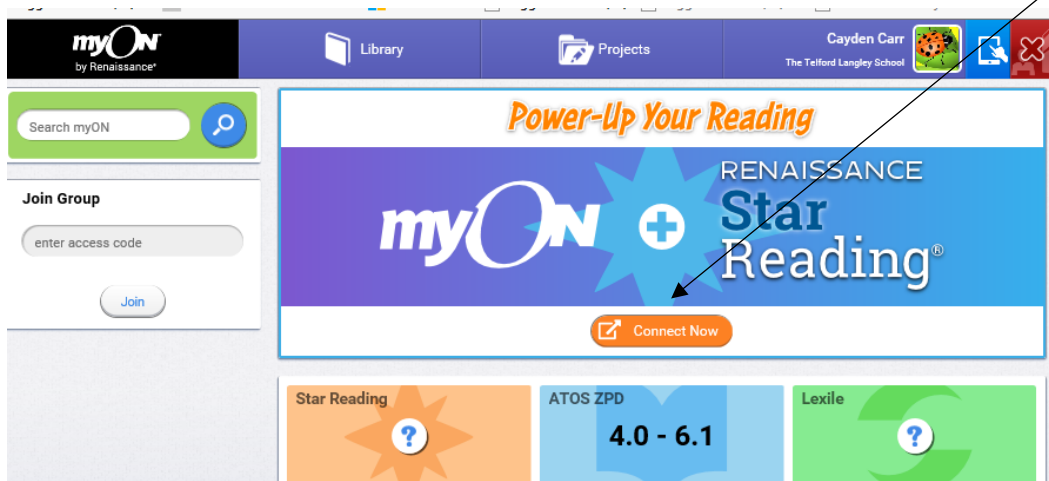


- Once you have logged in, myON will give you choices of the kind of books which you prefer. Although you do still have access to all of the books available.




Click on the ones you prefer, and then click on save.

6. Log in using your AR login and password (langlely) and click on log in





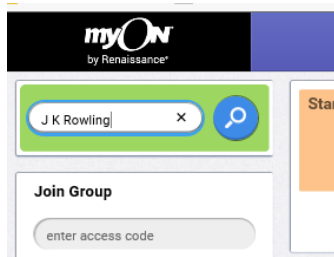
8. You then need to log out of myON:



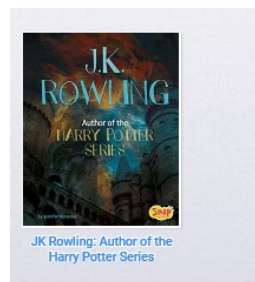
9. And then log back in as you did previously. Your true ZPD will then show.



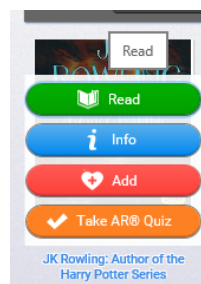
10. You can now browse the books on offer and choose either a fiction or non-fiction text.
